

#### Safe use of Transdermal HRT – What You Need to Know

## Why This Matters

Hormones are powerful. Transdermal HRT (oestrogen or testosterone gels/creams) can be life-changing for the person taking them — but can sometimes unintentionally transfer to others via skin contact.

This isn't about fear — it's about awareness and protection.

## Who's at Risk?

- **Children** especially with repeated skin contact.
- **Pets** even spayed animals can be affected.
- Partners via close skin contact.

## **Real Stories**

- A 6-year-old regularly helped her mum rub in her gel without knowing the risk.
- A 17-year-old developed gynaecomastia requiring surgery; later linked to his mum's HRT, despite careful application and hand-washing.
- Pets "going into heat" despite being spayed (<u>BBC News, Oct 2023</u>)
- A Surrey toddler developed pubic hair and acne after exposure to her mum's testosterone gel (<u>Business Insider</u>)

## What the Research Says

"These cases highlight physical changes but also a psychological effect on the child and parents... Prescribers... have a responsibility to highlight risk and mitigation measures." – Endocrine Abstracts 2024

#### **How to Protect Loved Ones**

- Apply gel to areas that can be **covered with clothing**.
- Allow 20+ minutes drying time before contact.
- Wash hands thoroughly after applying.
- Avoid skin contact with children and pets around application sites.
- Store gels/creams safely out of reach.

# Why Aren't We Being Told?

Warnings on packaging are minimal. Safety advice is inconsistent. Awareness is low. It's time for a consistent message — from prescribers, pharmacists, and manufacturers.

#### Let's Talk About It

I'm pro-HRT. This isn't about stopping treatment — it's about making sure we have the *whole picture*. Because none of us would knowingly put our children or pets at risk.
